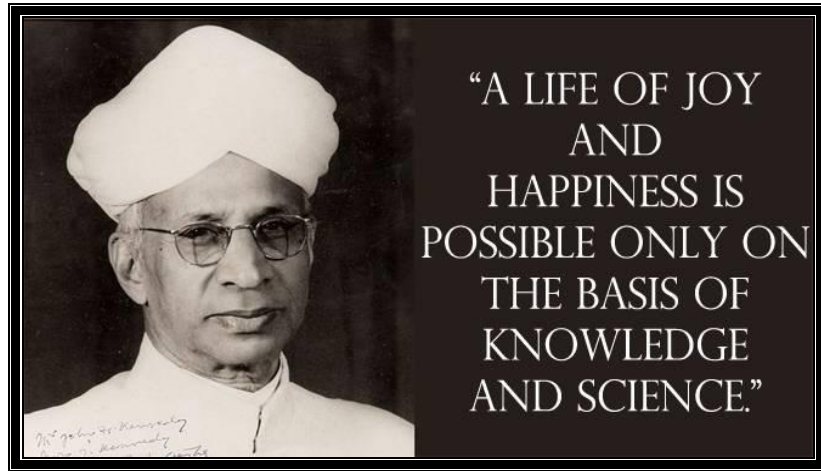

AUTHOR OF THE MONTH (Agatha Christie)



Agatha Christie was born in Torquay, Devon 1890 to Clarissa Margaret Boehmer and a wealthy American stockbroker. She was brought up by both her mother and her sister. She was an English writer of crime and romantic novels. She is best remembered for her detective. Agatha Christie began writing in 1920, after the end of the First World War. Her first story was *The Mysterious Affair at Styles*, (1920). She went on to write over 40 novels. Christie worked in the pharmacy of the University College London. In 1971 she was appointed Dame Commander of the British Empire. She died in 1976 aged 85. Some of her best written books are-

- Peril at End House (1932)
- Murder on the Orient Express (1934)
- The ABC Murders (1935) ...
- And Then There Were None (1939)

- 3) Our school celebrated SWACHHATA PAKHWADA from 1st to 15th September.

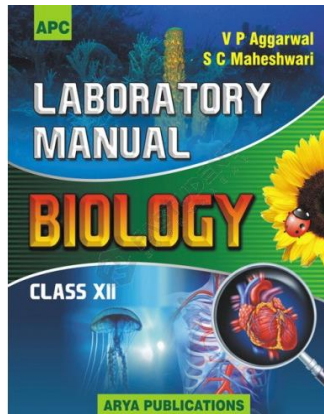
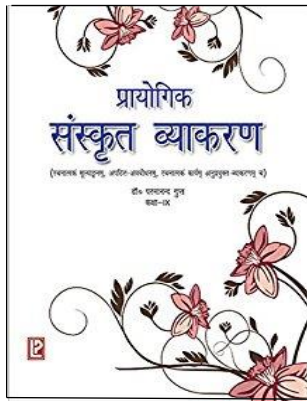
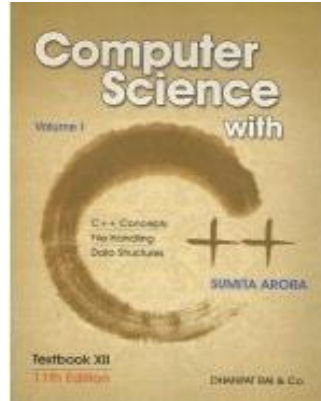
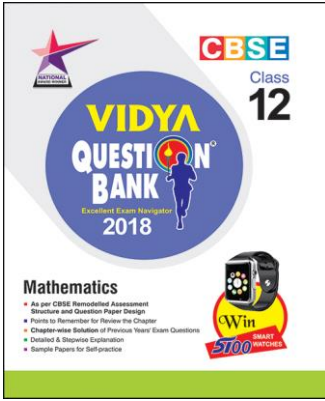

CAREER (To become a Pilot)

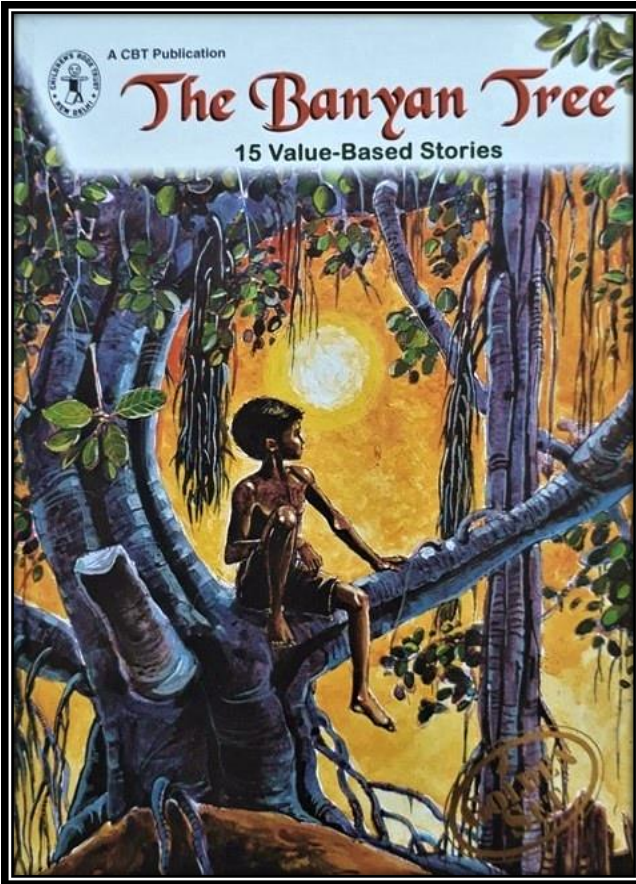


- 1) Get a four-year college degree.

- 5) Complete your certified flight instructor (CFI) rating and begin working at your flight school.
- 6) Apply to airlines you would like to fly for as soon as you have the minimum requirements.
